Discussion

Read Acts 2:42-47 and 2 Corinthians 8:15.

What do you wish could be true in your life that is described in this passage? What makes that hard to attain?



When has someone served you in a way that humbled you with gratitude? How has that encouraged or prompted you to serve others in a similar way?

In both passages that we've read today, we see that the early followers of Jesus cared for one another in a counter cultural way. Where there were needs, individuals stepped up willingly to meet those needs and gave from their abundance so that no one would be lacking. It is hard to imagine others living together in this way, no matter the historical period. It is especially hard to imagine this today when people seem to be "looking out for number one" more than ever.

What makes it hard for you as an individual to live in this way with others, regardless of how they respond?

It is hard to deny that the picture from Acts 2 is beautiful. There are few who would say they don't desire for the world to be open to service and caring for one another in this way. Yet, actually practicing this way of living is extremely hard. This is only amplified by the fact that we often don't trust the motivations of others and want to protect ourselves by burned by a lack of good will on the part of others.



What do you know about how Jesus served people? Is it possible that people could ever out serve Him, no matter how much of their lives they gave away for His sake? How does this reality stir in you a desire toward greater service of others?
