SESSION 1

MAIN POINT

We need to calibrate our thoughts to what Jesus has already said. Genesis 1:26/John 1:14

INTRODUCTION:

Did you/would you want to know the gender of your baby before it's birth? Why or why not?

- 1. <u>Gender Identity:</u> Gen 1:26-28; John 1:14; video;
 - a. Our culture is experiencing a rise in gender dysphoria and culture is carrying the conversation. The church must provide a theological foundation for gender identity and equip our congregations with the ability to respond to others with both conviction and kindness.
 - The Bible's teaching on sexuality is becoming increasingly disregarded or scorned in our culture, yet we are called to tell the truth about these things, even when they are offensive.
 - -Anchored in something that never changes: Bible; respond with grace and truth,
 - -Full of compassion for others: many times we get caught in this statement: -"We are ok if people sin, as long as their sin is same as ours."
 - The Bible tells us to flee from sexual immorality (1 Cor. 6:18).

In contrast with all other sins, immorality is against one's own body. The meaning of these words is difficult to determine. Many

sins, such as substance abuse, gluttony, and suicide, have detrimental effects on the body. Paul's words do not refer to disease and/or other

damage caused by sin. Instead, his words are linked to the preceding discussion of 6:12–17. There Paul established that Christians' bodies are joined with Christ so that they become "members of Christ" (6:15) himself.
