## Sun Catcher

- Tell the Bible story "Noah and the Ark" (Genesis 6–9). Remind kids that God's promises in the Bible are true.
- Provide black construction paper squares, cellophane, glue, and scissors.
- Lead kids to fold their construction paper squares in half, then in half again, and then once more diagonally.
- Guide kids to cut out sections of their folded papers as if making paper snowflakes.
- Guide each child to carefully unfold her cut paper square and glue it to a cellophane square.
- Encourage each child to use gel pens to write God's promises are true! across a strip of paper.
- Instruct kids to turn their sun catchers so they are diamond shaped.
- Help them glue the strip of paper across the center. Attach a ribbon to the top for hanging the sun catcher.
- Encourage kids to display their sun catchers as a reminder that God keeps His promises.





- black construction paper— Cut into 6-inch squares, one for each child. Cut a 6-by-1-inch strip for each child.
- brightly colored cellophane—Cut into
  6-inch squares, one for each child.
- · scissors, glue
- · gel pens, ribbon



- The Triumphal Entry (Matthew 21:1-17)
- Encourage kids to write Jesus loves all people! across the strips of paper.



- · Jacob and Esau (Genesis 25:19-33; 27:1-45; 32:1-21; 33:1-11)
- Encourage kids to write I can live in peace with my family! across the strips of paper.



- Jesus Fed Five Thousand (John 6:1-13)
- Encourage kids to write Jesus cares for people's needs! across the strips of paper.
